

Right Angles

What is a 90° angle?


A most common form of a right angle, or **90° angle**, includes two perpendicular lines meeting at an apex. This forms a perfect 'L' or corner shape.

Right angles are represented with a square, as opposed to other angles which are depicted in Mathematics with a curved line. Knowing that one angle is a right angle can allow maths students to calculate other angles within a shape.

Tip!

Use the corner of a piece of paper.


If it fits perfectly into the corner of a shape you have found a right angle!



Spelling:

Home learning also includes a range of spellings that are expected to be learnt at home. These spellings will be set on a Friday and tested on the following Friday. These spellings can be found in a child's reading record.

These spellings maybe from children's personalised spelling lists, linked to their current learning enquiry or common words that are expected to be spelt correctly in order for a child to achieve age related expectations.





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
